The mission of Oconee County Middle School is to provide a safe, challenging, and positive learning environment that inspires and educates all students to become responsible citizens.

Course Description:

The Chorus Classes at OCMS consist of 6th Grade Beginning Choir (Treble), 7th Grade Intermediate Choir (Treble or Mixed), and 8th Grade Advanced Choir (Mixed). Students in these choirs will sing music consisting of Unison, 2-Part, 3-Part and 4-Part arrangements, depending on ability level. These classes meet in the OCMS Chorus Room for 50 minutes per day.

Prerequisite:

General Music course in elementary school or previous music experience.

Course Objectives/Goals:

OCMS Chorus is a positive learning environment where students learn the essentials of music through singing. This course is based on the current Georgia Performance Standards and National Core Arts Standards. Chorus will include, but not be limited to: fundamentals in sight singing, music theory, music history, and the rehearsal and performance of repertoire appropriate for middle school choirs. Repertoire will include music from the Renaissance through Modern-day and will include music from America and countries around the world. Students will rehearse within the ensemble and have opportunities for solo and group performance.

Performance Rule:

Performances are mandatory and are the cumulative exam grades for the course.

In the event that a student conflict falls on a performance date, parents must contact Dr. Donaldson in writing (via e-mail) to request permission for their child to be excused from the performance.

Appropriate reasons for missing a concert include: wedding/funeral, student illness, or school state sports tournament. Students who are excused by Dr. Donaldson will be required to complete an alternate assignment to make up the cumulative exam grade. **Students who miss a performance for an unexcused reason will receive a zero for the cumulative exam grade.** Students with more than one unexcused performance absence will not be able to continue the course the following semester.

Late Work Policy:

The student has one school day for each day missed, plus one additional day to complete make-up work.
Additional time to complete make-up work will be determined by the teacher on a case-by-case basis.

Parent Expectations:

Because our program relies heavily on the support of our parent volunteers, we ask that at least one parent or guardian of each child enrolled in Chorus volunteer to help with at least one fundraiser OR concert during the 2022 - 2023 school year. Please sign up on the Google Form (using the QR Code on page 4). We will also send out "Sign-Up Genius" links for parents to sign up digitally before each event. Thank you!

Grading:

1. Formative: Daily Participation, Written Work, Quizzes, Sight Singing Assessments (30%)
2. Summative: Dress Rehearsals and Semester Projects (20%)
3. Summative: Chorus Concerts (50%) - MANDATORY (See Above)

Course Changes: Chorus students will be automatically re-enrolled in Chorus the following year. Students wishing to switch out of the class must make the request through the office Course Change Form which must be signed by Dr. Donaldson by the end of the 4th Quarter. New students will not be allowed to switch into Chorus their 7th or 8th grade years without a recommendation from a previous music teacher. These requests must be submitted directly to Dr. Donaldson: kdonaldson@oconeeschools.org.

Chorus Behavioral Expectations: (PBIS)**Respectful:**

Students are expected to behave towards their director and peers in a positive and respectful manner.

Responsible:

Water is the only drink allowed in the Chorus Room. Food, gum, or other drinks are prohibited.

Cell phones are not allowed in the classroom or bathroom.

Students must use the digital hall pass for restroom use. Students may not use the restroom during transitions.

Students are only allowed to use the piano, practice rooms, or teacher's office with permission.

Successful:

At the beginning of each class period, students are expected to enter the classroom quietly (Level 1), place their book bags by their chairs, take out their music folders, pencils, highlighters, and water bottles and quietly wait for instruction.

Students will participate in class and in after-school rehearsals and performances with their best effort!

For Students who do not meet the Chorus Expectations (PBIS)

Step 1: Verbal Warning, Re-teach behavior, Student/Teacher Conference

Step 2: Parent Phone Call from Teacher, Re-teach behavior

Step 3: Lunch Detention, Parent Phone Call from Teacher, Re-teach behavior

Step 4: Afternoon Detention, Parent Phone Call from Teacher

Step 5: Office Referral, Parent Phone Call from OCMS Administration

Students who refuse to participate during class will be moved to a different course the following semester.
